In the afternoon I preached a funeral sermon on the death of William Grove lost on 6<sup>th</sup> of May, drowned in the harbor of New York, by falling down with a plank on the side of Steam Ship *Franklin* where he was at work - His body was recovered only on 24<sup>th</sup> of May, having been 18 days in the water. & was buried by his wife



In Greenwood Cemetery, His wife  
was present and a large congregation  
of seamen. He was one of the boats  
crew of ship New York who with  
Serene saved the lives of 66 persons  
from aboard the burning ship Ocean  
Monarch a few miles from Liverpool.

I attended the funeral of James Dale a seaman, born in England Aged 26 years. who fell into the water (while going on board his vessel, the British Brig Candidate of Belcombe lying at the foot of Wall St outside of the vessel at Pier No. 16. on the Eve of Friday June 25. 1852 and was picked up after being 6 hours in the water - The funeral services were performed on the deck of the brig under an awning where the corpse was laid in presence of his Superior & the Commandant of the Brig, Capt Wm H Forbes - His officers & Mr E M. Duncan Treasurer of our Board, The corpse was taken the afternoon to Greenwood Cemetery
