that 44 years ago I gave him the Pilgrim Manual
& the Pilgrim Progress which he had set and
which both my conversations had made a
deep religious impression on his mind. He now
appears a converted man - has left off drinking
and all his vicious habits & is in daily habits
of prayer - He ^{has} just returned from an East India
voyage, has been home only a week &
intends to sail from Southwell's boarding house
in Cherry St where he boards to Europe this
afternoon. He said he could not leave the
Port without coming to see me & thank
me for the good I had been instrumental
in doing his soul & he wished me to pray
for him & said he should pray that God would
bless my labors for the spiritual benefit of their
country as he had blessed them for his. This is the

only intelligence I have had of this man for 4 years & until today I never heard whether I had been instrumental in doing him any good, for he was a very hardened degraded abandoned man, who had been often whipped almost to death on board the Porpoise and was looked upon by all officers and men as wholly lost to the world for any good sake for the rest.

who became very active in the absence of any
chaplain in the sick bay in exhorting the sick
and the dying on the subject of religion. Among
the number to whom he spoke was a Swedish
Sailor from Björnes in Finland then supposed
to be at the point of death. who afterwards recovered
and was enabled to sit up and read ^{the words of the foregoing} some religious
books I had put on board the Ship. which by the
influence of God's Spirit caused his conversion.
He afterwards returned to New York and brought
with him his three year wages of 700 Rixdollar
This sum he placed in the hands of the Swedish
Consul and requested him to send it to Sweden
to restore some money he dishonestly obtained
on leaving home, with principal and interest
when he was a arts unprincipled boy and man

away and took ^{me off} to the sea - for a livelihood. He
had shipped on board the United States Ship Constitution
for a 3 year cruise and in Valparaiso on being
discharged became a professor of religion and
has since been very active and consistent in
the religious life and instrumental in the con-
version of others. The pious Madame who
was the instrument of his conversion contin-
ued to labor on and had made himself
a very efficient and useful ^{man} as the religious
welfare of all with whom he associated.
It was at the last accounts going on his
way rejoicing - God be praised for these instances
of his abounding mercy. through Jesus our Lord.
