I then preached the sermon to a very full congregation on the text 'Surely the Isles shall wait for me & the ships of Tarshish first' which a collection was taken up for the Prot Epis Ch Missy Society for seamen in the city of New York.

Rev. Mr. [Name] preached & preached at the Broadway Ch for Savonar in my place.
