In 2006, over 1,600 ocean-going, coastal and inland mariners received training in advanced pilothouse management, advanced firefighting and other critical courses at SCI's facilities in Paducah, Kentucky and Houston, Texas. Using a state-of-the-art simulator system with interactive vessel bridges and pilothouses, SCI instructors recreate real-life scenarios that help captains and pilots build upon their navigational and bridge-management skills.

In New York, SCI's maritime licensing counselor assisted mariners on a one-on-one basis, guiding them through complex licensing and documentation requirements to obtain and renew their papers. Responding to calls and email 7 days a week, the counselor answered questions, provided updates on the latest US Coast Guard information and changes and walked dozens of mariners through the process step-by-step.

Seamen's Church Institute Educates Mariners

SCI'S BRIDGE SIMULATION SAVES KENTUCKY \$50 MILLION

During 2006, Wilbur Smith Associates (WSA) had the privilege of working with the Seamen's Church Institute (SCI) for the Louisville Southern Indiana Ohio River Bridges Project. This project consists of the construction of a new Ohio River bridge immediately upstream from the existing I-65 Bridge and the construction of a new Ohio River Bridge in the east end connecting I-265 in Kentucky and Indiana.

WSA contracted with SCI to create a realistic computer-generated simulation of barges and tug boats navigating this reach of the Ohio River through existing and future bridges. SCI performed this work very professionally and expertly.

Representatives from the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet, Indiana Department of Transportation, Federal Highway Administration and US Coast Guard were on site to observe SCI's work and professional riverboat pilots navigating this reach of the Ohio River using "virtual reality."

Based on this exercise and resulting comments from the riverboat pilots, the US Coast Guard took the unprecedented steps of "changing their minds" as to the bridge span requirements for the new structure near the I-65 Bridge.

Based on the information created by SCI, this educated change in requirements is estimated to save \$50 million in construction costs for Kentucky. Therefore, SCI's work and its computer simulation certainly saved the Commonwealth significant time and money.

SCI HOSTS TWIC ROUNDTABLE

The Seamen's Church Institute hosted a roundtable on the Transportation Worker Identification Credential (TWIC), as well as mariner licensing and documentation on October 31, 2006, at its New York City headquarters.


Attended by 22 members of industry and government representing 10 states, the roundtable offered the opportunity to exchange opinions and ideas relating to the significant changes occurring in the maritime industry relating to services, health, and credentialing.

Participants expressed concerns relating to:

- Cost to mariners and possible employment delays while applying for TWIC;
- ~ Technological requirements of the card and card readers;
- ~ Compatibility with future international ID requirements; and
- ~ Differences between applicability, impact, and implementation of the TWIC to the deep-sea and the inland waterway maritime industries.

Operating from SCI's International Seafarers' Center in the Port of New York and New Jersey, chaplains trained in recognizing and addressing fatigue, depression and anxiety, and versed in seafarers' rights, assist thousands of seafarers on tankers, cargo ships and passenger liners.

The staff and volunteers at SCI's International Seafarers' Center in Port Newark welcomed over 57,000 seafarers, port workers, and truckers in a safe, friendly environment for relaxation, recreation, and spiritual refreshment.

The impact of SCI's pastoral care and services is evidenced in a seafarer's smile upon hearing a family member's voice on an SCI phone; in the relief of a mariner who has been able to discuss a legal concern with a chaplain; in the appreciation of a cruise ship worker who has been helped through a crisis.

Seamen's Church Institute Serves Seafarers and Cruise Ship Workers

SCI OPENS NEW CENTER IN BROOKLYN

When the spectacular Queen Mary 2 docked on her inaugural visit to open the new \$56 million Brooklyn Cruise Terminal on April 15, 2006, SCI chaplains were there to greet her crew of over 1,000 workers. Chaplains served seafarers from a table in the crew's dining room while SCI's Hospitality Center was under construction over the next 5 months.

On September 15, the Institute officially opened a 300-squarefoot Hospitality Center in Brooklyn for the crew next to their entrance to the ship. Few passengers entering the gleaming 4,000 passenger terminal ever notice SCI's small space, but its importance for the crew is significant.

Cruise ship workers find the same kindness, care, and concern they give to passengers when the workers themselves encounter an SCI chaplain. This is especially welcome to cruise ship workers because, to meet the demands of the fast-paced industry, they typically work for 9 straight months in shifts without a single day off.

Like SCI's "sister" Hospitality Center at the Passenger Ship Terminal in Manhattan, the Brooklyn Center serves thousands of cruise ship workers. During their few hours off-duty in Brooklyn, the cruise ship workers can wire money home, receive counseling from a trained chaplain, and call their families.

SCI also provides services to cruise ship workers arriving at Cape Liberty Cruise Ship terminal in Bayonne, New Jersey.

During a seafarer's absence, a child may be born, children grow older and their personalities blossom and change, and spouses may learn new ways to cope without their significant other's presence. This is the seafaring stranger a port chaplain is honored to meet every day. It is a stranger who in a few short moments may connect with a chaplain in a moment of grace. In that significant moment he/she becomes blessed and feels "found" or "known" and more herself/himself. The stranger that walks through your church door may be part of your community yet a stranger to the liturgy or culture, or even the language of your church. Seamen's Church Institute Changes the Lives of Mariners

"As the SCI port chaplain visited the vessel, the crew told him about the 2nd Officer, who had had an accident while the ship was berthed. The Officer was giving directions to a dockworker who was handling the tension-filled rope that attached the ship to the piling. Suddenly the rope came off the piling, spun wildly around and caught the 2nd Officer's right knee. His kneecap was completely shattered. He was taken to a Medical Center. Another SCI chaplain went to visit him, finding him totally alone. He had no relatives or friends near the Medical Center and no way of contacting his wife in the Philippines. The SCI chaplain provided him with a phone, phone cards, and prayer. After his medical treatment was completed, the chaplain worked with the agent to arrange his flight home and then procured the proper release papers from the hospital."

"I had just gotten off the phone with my wife, and things weren't going well at home. My 18-month-old son was running a fever, his 5-year-old sister had fallen off her bike and busted her lip, and my 7-year-old son was in trouble at school—again. My wife was at her wits end, I was 10 days into my 28-day hitch, and there was nothing I could do to help her. Meanwhile, we had two green deckhands, and were in a 52-hour wait to get through Lock 52. It was hot and tempers were short. All I wanted to do was get off and go home. You just can't imagine how good it was to see the Ministry on the River chaplain get on board with a newspaper and some new books and videos. We sat and talked for quite a while. Actually, I talked, and the chaplain listened. We had a prayer, and I can't tell you how much better I felt. It was just good to know that someone cared about me and my family."

Seamen's Church Institute Provides Care to River Mariners

MINISTRY ON THE RIVER

This is a condensed and updated version of a story which previously appeared in the October 2006 issue of Heartland Boating magazine.

Founded in 1834 and affiliated with the Episcopal Church, the Seamen's Church Institute is an icon in the Port of New York and New Jersey, serving nearly 4,000 ships each year. Its multilingual chaplains and legal counselors have developed a long-standing reputation for providing international seafarers with pastoral care and assistance with family, employment, medical and contractual concerns.

Few may know of SCI's similar services being provided to the nation's 33,000 inland mariners who share many of the same problems with isolation, boredom and fatigue as their blue-water counterparts. Towboat crews working along the Gulf Intracoastal Waterway, Mississippi and Ohio Rivers or their tributaries endure the same dangerous conditions, substantial physical hardships and longing for their families as shipboard sailors do. Even though always in site of land, towboaters are nonetheless isolated from their families and shore side friends for 30 days or more at a time.

During their normal 28-30 day "hitch," towboat crews live onboard the boat and work two 6-hour "watches" (or shifts) per day, alternating between 6 am until noon and from noon until 6 pm. During their time off watch, the crew must cram in a few hours of sleep as well as do their laundry, eat and tend to personal hygiene. This repetitive routine leaves very little time for relaxation but still allows plenty of time to reflect on the fact that he/she is a long way from home and family.

As with ocean seafarers, the towboat crew lifestyle often precludes traditional participation in churches, clubs and community service organizations. It also often causes a career river person to miss many family events such as first birthdays, dance recitals, championship ball games and wedding anniversaries. These inherent realities, along with the stresses arising within their families, can create a feeling of guilt or loneliness for the river mariners which sometimes is overwhelming.

According to Ann Mills, Coordinator of Special Projects for SCI's Ministry on the River, local, land-based support systems and organizations are generally not equipped to handle the unique challenges or understand the towboater's lifestyle, work schedule, mental pressures or frustrations. She believes that this is where Ministry on the River literally steps aboard to

offer assistance and stability to someone who, although only a few thousand yards from shore, may be floundering in a sea of isolation.

She related that the ministry includes a pastoral outreach system for river workers and their families, extending from Pittsburgh to New Orleans with chaplains operating out of Louisville, Paducah and Baton Rouge. Since its inception, the Ministry on the River program has developed a network of more than 100 River Friendly Churches from 11 denominations as partners to offer pastoral care and assistance through 4 full-time staff members and 27 trained clergy and lay volunteers.

Several hundred school children and adult church members now participate in SCI's Easter on the River and Christmas on the River programs. These volunteers decorate and fill boxes with greeting cards, candy, personal items and non-denominational devotional booklets appropriate for the season. The boxes are packed at several locations along the rivers and are taken to participating companies for distribution to their boats.

Mills says she knows the gift boxes don't change the fact that the crews are away from home on the special holiday. "It's a reminder that they're not forgotten, that somebody knows they're out there and they care."

SCI's program providing Christmas gifts to mariners reached a record 16,210 handknitted items, homemade cookies, and cards from children in 2006.

The tradition of handknitted gifts for the Christmas at Sea program stretches back to its beginning in 1898 during the Spanish American War. Today, knitted items including hats, scarves, vests, and socks are collected year-round at the Institute's international headquarters in Lower Manhattan.

Handmade presents from almost 4,000 knitters representing every state, as well as gift items from River Friendly Churches, are wrapped in individual packages. In late autumn, the gifts boxes are delivered to ships heading out to sea, and to river towboats whose crews will be away from home during the holidays.

Hello Everyone,

Many years ago, my father mentioned the Seamen's Church as part of his days as a Merchant Seaman. I never realized the impact that his stories had upon my heart and soul. After his death, his stories would be silenced only to echo in the hallways of my mind.

Today, while at a knitting class in Newburgh, New York, my instructor mentioned the Seamen's Church. She suggested that we could knit a scarf or a cap. Today, I remembered my father and the cap that he was buried with. Coming from a poor immigrant Italian family in the East Bay section of Rhode Island, he had little opportunity. The only promise of a bright future awaited where the Mighty Atlantic met the coastline and called out to him at the window of his childhood home.

I want to participate in this program as a personal memory of my father, Matthew Anthony Stabile, and his best friend throughout childhood, Carl Goff. I remember the caps and scarves that were once given to them. My father kept his cap close to his heart (literally on the left inside pocket of his coat). He was forever appreciative that someone, somewhere, thought of him during the holiday season while he was at sea.

I will work tirelessly on various caps and scarves. This way, merchant mariners will know they too are far from being forgotten.





Mother Janet Roper

Janet Roper began her ministry to seafarers as a 19-year-old in Boston and later worked with her husband in his chaplaincies at Seamen's Institutes in St. John, New Brunswick, Canada and Portland, Oregon. In 1915, newly widowed, Mother Roper joined the Seamen's Church Institute in New York as House Mother. "Mother Roper will fix it" became a commonly-heard phrase regarding everything from the need for a small loan, to missing baggage, to broken hearts.

From World War I and continuing until 1943, Mother Roper tackled the job that would make her famous: locating missing seamen on behalf of worried friends and family members. Her Missing Seamen Bulletins were posted in shipping offices, seamen's clubs, hotels, and taverns around the world. Although she never met or spoke to most of them, Mother Roper's tireless efforts led to the reunion of thousands of mariners with their loved ones.

The Janet Lord Roper Society

In honor of Janet Lord Roper, who spent 28 years at the Seamen's Church Institute as "Mother Roper" for thousands of seafarers, SCI created its planned giving society in her name.

As seafarers confronted unpredictable seas, loneliness and difficult living conditions, people ashore have welcomed mariners arriving in port and ensured that their next voyage carried reminders of God's presence and love. At SCI, this tradition continues today, serving both inland and deep-sea mariners, thanks to the support of thousands of donors and volunteers – and the lifetime gifts of those who have remembered SCI in their wills and estate plans.
