## Message From The Director

My Dear Friends,

The advent of the nineties has signaled profound change in the world community. Recently we've witnessed the unraveling of a great nation as democracy triumphed over an embedded tyranny and an old enemy became a fading menace. Change has come as well to The Seamen's Church Institute.

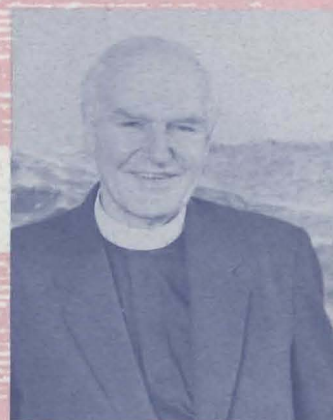
We are at a pivotal juncture in the evolution of the maritime industry. Sophisticated technological advances in navigation and ship design, global shifts in maritime commerce, the aging of the seafaring population, and increasing concern for our marine environment and safety-at-sea herald a new and challenging era for the Institute.

Change for SCI is not new. A century ago Liverpool packets were anchored at the South Street Seaport and horse drawn carriages bounced across the cobblestones carrying cocoa, cheese, molasses and spices from the Indies. The Institute's ship visitors greeted ships that called upon the Port of New York in SCI's two boats, the *Sentinel* and the *J. Hamersley Hooker*. Chaplains today drive modern vans for their welcoming visits to ships of all nations.

Throughout our distinguished history the Institute has assumed a mantle of creative leadership—perceiving, understanding and accommodating the demands of progress and the challenges of time. And we have done so without compromising the integrity of our mission nor the vitality of our programs. Whether pursuing protective legislation for seafarers at the turn of the century or founding our Maritime Training School and our Christmas-at-Sea program in the early 1900s, SCI has charted a course close to the cutting-edge of the changing fortunes and needs of the seafaring community we serve.

These past months in our magnificent new home have been a joy. As I suggested to you last March, rumor had it that The Seamen's Church Institute had disappeared. I am happy to advise—in the words of Mark Twain—"that reports of our death are greatly exaggerated." With the hoisting of our flag over 241 Water Street, the Institute has reaffirmed its presence as an important force in the maritime community. The expertise of our superb staff, the selfless dedication of our volunteers and the ongoing support of our many friends have helped position the Institute as a highly regarded maritime educator and ambassador of good will. This profile extends well beyond our immediate neighbors and reflects the increasingly multinational personality of the industry.

Some are in a position to give most generously to our programs. The majority who contribute to SCI, however, are not. Often their gifts involve sacrifice. To all of our loyal donors we extend our heartfelt gratitude. The borders and coast lines of cities and countries may change. The size and design of ships and the nature of energy and manpower to operate them may be transformed, but time cannot alter the contours of the human heart. With your continued help, as long as men and women set out to sea, The Seamen's Church Institute will be there for them—a bulwark against the strains and hazards of life at sea.

## Message From The Board of Managers

Dear Friends,

How is The Seamen's Church Institute faring? We are pleased to report that we are very well indeed and activities of recent years augur well for continued prosperity as we greet the decade of the nineties.

Conscientious stewardship of SCI's financial resources by the board of managers, aggressive fund raising strategies and ever-expanding programmatic and community outreach services have reaffirmed our leadership position as a champion of seafarers' rights and safe seas. The completion of the Institute's distinctive headquarters and Seafarers' Center is one of our proudest accomplishments to date. The new six-story Center is eminently appropriate to our contemporary needs, affording ample space for the effective operation of the Institute's maritime training programs, seafarers' rights, and social and pastoral services.

We are pleased to be able to share our new home, which lies within Manhattan's South Street Seaport Historic District, with our business and residential neighbors. The Seaport Chapel, truly an ecumenical house of worship, soon will offer regular services as well as cultural performances for the community. The "Top Deck" Community Conference Center with picturesque views of the Brooklyn Bridge and lower Manhattan is an ideal setting for corporate meetings and social events.

The Institute recently introduced the President's Council, an advisory committee of new friends, committed to promoting SCI's programs while at the same time enhancing their own knowledge of maritime issues. During 1990 the President's Council welcomed the Princess Royal to The Seamen's Church Institute. They sailed on SCI's traditional Pilot Boat Cruise, enjoying a behind-the-scenes tour of the Port of New York and New Jersey where much of the Institute's services take place. The group is currently evaluating activities for the future.

Our contributors have remained faithful in their support of our cause. In 1990 we were fortunate to receive several major grants to both the annual and capital funds. Among them was a \$20,000 gift from the New York Community Trust which enabled the Center for Seafarers' Rights to research the needs of commercial fishers; \$50,000

from the Henry Luce Foundation—continuing their support of the Asian/North American Pastoral Training Program; and \$25,000 for a new SCI van from Michael Maher, a member of the board of managers.

Together gifts from individuals and estates accounted for 45 percent of the total funds raised providing an invaluable base for ongoing operational support of the Institute's programs. It is important to note that many of our individual donors make more than one gift each year.


As many of you are aware, the most significant current capital need is that of the new administrative building and Seafarers' Center in lower Manhattan. To meet this need a \$4 million campaign was initiated during 1990. The campaign includes a special fund to endow the Christmas-at-Sea program, cherished by seafarers and SCI family.

This past year the board also approved a planned giving program to provide new funding options with significant tax benefits for donors.

As we look to the future the challenges and possibilities for SCI are great. We have served the maritime industry with dedication and pride for more than 157 years. We urge you to stay with us. # The Year In Review

## Seafarers' Services Division

Long periods of time at sea often occasion feelings of disconnectedness, loneliness and frustration for seafarers—a sense that life is passing them by. From our infancy ship visits by SCI's multilingual chaplains have been acknowledged as the centerpiece for the Institute's services. In 1990 port chaplains and ship visitors greeted more than 3,000 of the ships that called upon this port. Extending a friendly welcome they offered simple acts of hospitality, distributing magazines and newspapers, providing ground transportation and assistance with telephone calls and mail. They offered comfort to the downhearted, and counsel to the frightened



and insecure—a lifeline to seafarers from all corners of the globe.

More than 24,000 seafaring friends availed themselves of facilities at one of the Institute's three centers: the International Seafarers' Center in Port Newark, NJ, the Seafarers' Club in lower Manhattan and the Passenger Ship Terminal in upper Manhattan. Some came to worship; others for advice on problems related to their ship or crew; many came to call home, to play, or to just relax.

## Counseling Services

The pressing needs of inactive seafarers—many of whom live in the New York area—became a priority concern of Counseling Services in 1990. Visits to the Seafarers' Clubs where the social structure of a seagoing life thrives, recreational programs, monthly dinners, sports tournaments and field trips provided meaningful leisure-time activity for these aging and retired seafarers.

The division also developed an innovative counseling training program that prepares non-professionals to help others help themselves—somewhat of a psychological first aid. Some members of the SCI family—participants in the Asian/North American Pastoral Training Program, students in the Summer Intern Program, ship visitors and maritime training instructors—completed this program.

## Theological Education

The Asian/North American Pastoral Training Program celebrated its fifth successful year in 1990. The program was developed to help bridge the cross-cultural gap between an ever-increasing Asian work force and chaplains who minister in North American ports. With the Port of New York and New Jersey as their laboratory, trainees from the Philippines, Korea, Burma, Singapore and Malaysia have learned to minister to the many nationalities that comprise one transient congregation.

The Institute was encouraged to create this Pastoral Training Program following the success of its Summer Intern Program in Maritime Ministry. For many years the summer program has sensitized theology students to the complexity of ministering to people whose life, work experience and cultural backgrounds differ from their own.

## Maritime Training Division

Today SCI's Maritime Training Division is a leader in the field of maritime continuing education—the one against which all others are measured. It boasts some of the most sophisticated simulation equipment in the world and during 1990 began training merchant mariners in tug and barge handling using the simulation system. A new Automatic Radar Plotting Aid, which parallels the advanced technology used on more than 1,000 ships, was added to the system early in the year. SCI introduced on-the-job training with a program for Kloster Cruise Limited aboard several of their ships, including the *Royal Viking Star*, the *Southward* and the *Royal Viking Sky*.

In addition more than 350 students—masters and mates from major oil companies, tugboat operators, cruise lines, and the United States Coast Guard—participated in courses in ship handling, tug and barge handling, radar and firefighting. Each course is custom designed and reflects concepts inherent to adult education—that learning is a lifelong internal process controlled by the individual. Students encounter real-life situations and environments via the simulator equipment. This form of training is becoming increasingly valued as the most effective means of ensuring error-free performance at sea.



The Institute is grateful to the Henry Luce Foundation for its continuing support of the Asian/North American Pastoral Training Program. In 1990 the Foundation made the first payment on a second three-year grant.



The school also hosted a special training day for a group of Russian cadets from the sailing vessel *Druzba*, and was chosen for a site visit by students from the World Maritime University.

### **Center for Seafarers Rights**

A voice for those who have no voice, SCI's Center for Seafarers' Rights is the only one of its kind in the world. As it strives to promote dignity and justice for the thousands of men and women who make their living in the international workplace of the sea, the Center trains port chaplains and attorneys to defend the rights of merchant seafarers. It shares its expertise and observations with government policy-makers and others in the maritime industry and it counsels seafarers on their rights, helping them to help themselves.

The Center hosted a two-and-one-half day Chaplain Training Seminar during the fall to acquaint chaplains with the underlying legal principles that

govern a seafarer's life at sea. More than 30 chaplains from across the nation and Canada attended the event. As ship visitors and port chaplains are frequently the first to learn of seafarers' rights issues, it is essential that they receive this training. The Center hopes to build upon this success by conducting similar chaplain training seminars throughout the US and abroad in the near future.

The Center also advocated throughout the year on behalf of commercial fishers—the largest segment of seafarers in the U.S. As a result of a report published in June 1990, on the status of commercial fishers in the U.S., the International Council of Seamen's Agencies reactivated its commercial fishers committee to study problems that have an impact upon seafarers working in this industry. The report was distributed to the academic community, the clergy and to seafarers' agencies.

The proliferation of flag of convenience registries and their impact upon the well-being of seafarers is an increasingly serious concern for The Seamen's Church Institute. Last year the Center researched and revised "Seafarers' Rights on Cyprus Flag Ships," one of the many titles in its collection of literature on seafarers' rights. Written in layman's terms, the booklet summarizes the laws that affect seafarers on ships sailing under the Cyprus flag.

### **Christmas-at-Sea**

For most people Christmas means family, friends and celebration. For the merchant seafarer, however, traditional holiday festivities are the exception rather than the rule.

SCI's Christmas-at-Sea program brings the spirit of Christmas love and

cheer to those men and women who are at sea and far from home during the holiday season. A cherished tradition, Christmas-at-Sea involves the good will and efforts of more than 3,500 men and women who volunteer their time and energy to prepare more than 10,000 gift packages. In 1990 2,000 volunteer knitters throughout the country created more than 20,000 items—sweaters, scarves, caps and socks for the Christmas boxes that were distributed to seafarers from every land on Christmas Day.

The project intensifies each year in mid-October. The Christmas-at-Sea room at SCI becomes a veritable Santa's workshop as a small cadre of "local elves" gather to wrap the knitted garments and other gifts—sewing kits, stationery, pens, combs and more—into colorful packages. The boxes and handwritten notes are then packed into large cartons and delivered to hundreds of ships—including those chartered by the Military Sealift Command—that dock in the Port of New York and New Jersey during the weeks preceding the Christmas holidays.




